



FORMER COAST GUARD POSITIONS IN MANGALSALA
For those who are not indifferent to military history,
the construction of the fortifications of the Daugava estuary
coast guard artillery will seem interesting.
The first free state of Latvia and the Soviet government also
established their artillery positions here.
This is a unique object that is not found anywhere else
on the shores of the Baltic Sea. By order of the Ministry
of Culture in 2003, it came under state protection.

- Water sports enthusiasts can use the wake parks, kayak trips, as well as marinas in Riga and the surrounding areas.
- Cyclists are offered several rental bicycles and electric scooters, as well as a network of cycle paths.

Riga is located in the centre of the Baltic region in the central part of Latvia, on the southern coast of the Gulf of Riga.



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BALTIC SONG AND DANCE FESTIVAL TRADITION

- The organisation of joint singing and dancing festivals was once typical of many European countries, but only the Baltic states have preserved this unique tradition through the centuries
- The large-scale Baltic Song and Dance Festival is an authentic testament to the culture of folk song and dance culture on the scale and in the context of the entire Europe.
 - The Song and Dance Festival is not just a festival for a week, but daily work for dance groups, choirs, ensembles, and folk music groups as they are constantly preparing for the closing event, which takes place every five years, honing their skills.

THE SONG AND DANCE FESTIVAL
IS CONSIDERED TO BE A TRUE TESTAMENT
TO THE UNITY OF THE PEOPLE.

- The Latvian Song and Dance Festival takes place once every five years with a gala concert in Riga, Mežaparks Grand Stage or Song Festival Stage, and a gala concert of the Dance Festival in Riga, Daugava Stadium.
- In 2003, the Baltic Song and Dance Festival tradition was included on the UNESCO Representative List of the Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity. It promotes awareness of the value of this heritage, which is unique to the peoples of the Baltic states.







ARCHITECTURAL MONUMENTS



LATVIAN NATIONAL MUSEUM OF ART

One of the most outstanding examples of historicist architecture in the capital of Latvia. The museum was opened in 1905 and has operated through all the twists and turns of 20th century history. The museum houses the works of the most important Latvian artists. The building was completely reconstructed in 2016. The museum visitors' greatest interest and attention is attracted by the renovated and modernised environment in the museum, where you can both gain a broad insight into Latvian art for centuries and fully enjoy your free time.


RIGA BOURSE

A structural unit of the Latvian National Museum of Art, located in the very centre of Riga's Old Town, Dome Square. The Riga Stock Exchange building is the most visible example of the Venetian Renaissance palazzo architecture style in Latvia. The Art Museum Riga Bourse holds the largest collection of foreign art in the Baltics, which was started by the City Council members, merchants and mayors of Riga as early as in the 19th century. The Art Museum Riga Bourse building is an architectural monument of national significance. It was built between 1852 and 1855, imitating the forms of the Venetian Renaissance palazzo, which symbolises wealth and abundance.



LATVIAN NATIONAL OPERA AND BALLET

Built in the second half of the 19th century, the building was originally built as a theatre; the City German Theatre. The building was opened in 1856. This is a wonderful example of an eclectic classicism style. The decorations of the building on the north-eastern façade stand out: images from Greek mythology and other mythological figures related to theatrical art. The main façade of the Latvian National Opera and Ballet building, shaped in classical forms, is marked by six mighty Ionian columns. Above columns is the pediment of the building, decorated with several allegorical figures: Apollo, tragedy and comedy symbols, etc.



CULTURAL SITES AND EVENTS

ART NOUVEAU

ZUZEUM

ZUZEUM ART CENTRE

After the transformation of the so-called Dream Factory building in the first half of 2020, Zuzeum invites everyone to enjoy the art in the two 1,100-square-metre exhibition halls, the sculpture garden, the café, and the roof terrace. Zuzeum is the largest private art museum in the Baltics.

Zuzeum exhibits the collection of art collector and patron Jānis Zuzāns. Representing more than twenty thousand different genres, the collection of works of art is the largest private collection of Latvian art in the world.

The art centre is housed in a historic factory complex, built in 1910 according to a design by the Baltic German architect and engineer Edmund von Trompowski.





HOUSE OF THE BLACKHEADS

One of the most luxurious buildings in Riga, which preserves both the unique historical heritage of the legendary Brotherhood of Blackheads and the history of Riga. The house was built in the 14th century and rebuilt several times until it was completely destroyed during the Second World War. In 1999, the House of the Blackheads was rebuilt in its original form by the City of Riga.

Historically, the main function of the house was to promote entrepreneurship - it was a gathering place

for merchants and sailors for several centuries. When visiting the house, everyone can go on an exciting history tour and get acquainted with its beautiful halls, historic offices and medieval cellars.

The exhibition also offers a view of the largest silver collection in the Baltics, crystal candlesticks, weapons, armour, and other historical artefacts.



ALBERTA STREET

- Alberta Street is the pearl of Riga's Art Nouveau style its magnificent, historic Art Nouveau style buildings are located
- Alberta Street and its houses are an outstanding flight of architects' imagination - 2, 2a, 4, 6, 8, 11, 12 and 13 Alberta
- Each of the houses is decorated with figurative sculptures, decorated balconies, columns, and other architectural elements, of Art Nouveau. The houses are decorated with wrought iron: excellent examples of Art Nouveau art can also be enjoyed indoors.
- The Art Nouveau Museum of Riga has also been opened unique style.

RUNNING ROUTES

- The LiveRiga portal offers 8 different running routes 3-21 km long, designed to make it possible to get to know Riga while running or walking.
- Routes are available in different parts of the city: in the Centre, Pārdaugava, Ķengarags, Teika, and they include different types of environment – parks, the Daugava, industrial districts, as well as let one enjoy the sunset on the shores of the Gulf of Riga at the right time.

SWIMMING IN RIGA – ALSO IN WINTER!

• LUCAVSALA (DAUGAVA)

Lucavsala beach is the central public bathing place in the City of Riga. The bathing area can be easily reached from the centre by trolleybus, bicycle, or car.

In winter, when Lucavsala is covered with snow, there is also a cross-country ski run.

• LAKE ĶĪŠEZERS

The lake is located in the greenest area of Riga, Mežaparks, and gathers swimmers all year round.

If there is enough frost and ice thickness in winter, an ice rink is also built on the lake.

• LAKE BĀBELĪTE

Located a short walk from the shopping centre Alfa, surrounded by forest. In the warm season, the lake is widely visited and rescuers take care of safety. In winter, the lake is used by winter swimming activists living in the area.

• VECĀKI BEACH

The beach allows you to combine a walk along the Gulf of Riga with a refreshing swim, even in winter. If Vecāķi is not en route, Vakarbuļļi and Bolderāja beaches are also available in Riga.







RIGA INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

RIGA INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

is the largest international aviation company in the Baltics. It is an important air hub for the whole of Northern Europe.

From Riga Airport, in the winter season it is possible to go to more than 70, but in the summer season – to more than 100 destinations provided by 20 airlines.

Riga Airport serves half of the total air travel and air cargo volume in the Baltic states.

From Riga International Airport, it is possible to travel to a total of 106 destinations all over the world. The airport did not stop its operations during the pandemic either: In 2020, Riga Airport handled 2.01 million passengers and received and dispatched 23,219 tonnes of cargo.


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RAIL BALTICA

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INFRASTRUCTURE IN RIGA

• The project envisages the construction of a new 1435 mm, or European standard gauge, railway line in the Baltic states.

• The aim of the project is to integrate the Baltic states into the European railway network.

• Five European Union countries participate in the project: Poland, Lithuania, Latvia, Estonia and Finland.

• The railway line will connect Helsinki, Tallinn, Pärnu, Riga, Panevežys, Kaunas, Vilnius, and Warsaw.

• It is planned that Rail Baltica will be commissioned in 2026.


 The total length of the route is 870 km, of which 265 km is in Latvia.


 Maximum train speed: 249 km/h (passenger transport), 120 km/h (freight transport).

• The planned cost of the project is 5.8 billion euros.

• 36,000 new jobs will be created.


 Rail Baltica will provide fast train services between the capitals of the Baltic states every two hours.





THE CONSTRUCTION OF RAIL BALTICA WILL CONTRIBUTE TO THE CITY'S RAILWAY INFRASTRUCTURE, MAKING IT SAFER:

- Rail crossings will be on two levels: rail will no longer have to be crossed
- The new crossings will be accessible to pedestrians, cyclists, mothers with baby carriages and people with reduced mobility.
- Road transport will cross the railway easier as you will not have to wait at level crossings.
- Two stations will be built in Riga for the needs of Rail Baltica:
 Riga Central Station and station at Riga Airport.
- Travellers will be able to get to Riga Airport from Riga Central Station in 8 minutes. The train will run every 30 minutes.
- By implementing this project, Riga, as the capital of Latvia, will gain a very significant potential - the central transport hub of the Baltics. This means gaining great development opportunities in the centre of Riga.





RAIL BALTICA ADVANTAGES GRANTED

DEVELOPMENT OF BICYCLE TRANSPORT IN RIGA

THE AIM OF THE CYCLING DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME IS TO PROMOTE THE GROWTH OF CYCLING, BOTH FOR BUSINESS AND RECREATIONAL PURPOSES, BY INTEGRATING THE CYCLING INFRASTRUCTURE INTO THE COMMON TRANSPORT SYSTEM OF THE CITY OF RIGA AND THE URBAN ENVIRONMENT.

In the period from 2015 to 2030, the following stages of bicycle traffic improvement are planned to be implemented:

- improvement of the bicycle infrastructure of the city centre;
- neighbourhood connections to the city centre;
- neighbourhood interconnections (radial connections);
- recreational sports and leisure routes;
- city connections with suburb municipalities.

ALREADY AVAILABLE AND PLANNED CYCLING ROUTES:

Centre-Imanta - 13.5 km long

In 2022, the construction of the Imanta-Bolderāja bicycle route will begin, which will allow access to Daugavgrīva from the Old Town by bicycle.

Centre-Mežaparks - 6.6 km long

The bicycle route will be connected to another 9.5 km long bicycle route Mežaparks-Vecmīlgrāvis-Vecāķi and will lead to the sea, the city beach.

Centre-Berģi - 14 km long

It starts in the Old Town and ends beyond the administrative border of Riga.

Centre-Dārziņi - 17 km long

It is mostly located along the bank of the Daugava, using the Daugava promenade.

In the construction season of 2020, the reconstruction of the Krasta Street pavement from Salu Bridge to South Bridge was started, making the bicycle infrastructure easy to use and improved. Currently, the specialists of the Traffic Department are studying the possibilities for building the bicycle route

Centre - Purvciems - Pļavnieki.

The technical development of the 5.7 km long bicycle route Centre - Tornakalns - Ziepniekkalns has started.






EASTERN HIGHWAY

IN 2021, THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE RIGA EASTERN HIGHWAY IN THE SECTION IERIĶU STREET-VIETALVAS STREET WAS STARTED.

- The construction of the missing section of the Eastern Highway is one of Riga's most ambitious traffic infrastructure projects in recent years, with a total cost of 37.8 million euros.
- The construction of the Eastern Highway will provide opportunities to bypass the centre of the city and relieve the historical centre of Riga and the Purvciems area from freight transport.
- The construction of the traffic infrastructure project is planned to be completed by June 2023.
- The project plans to build a single overpass over leriku and Dzelzavas streets in the length of 605 metres, rebuild the adjacent street carriageways as well as create single-level streets and two-level traffic junctions.
- During the construction, infrastructure will also be provided for pedestrians and cyclists. In turn, thinking about future prospects, additional public transport stops will be built in the vicinity of Dzelzavas Street.
- The project envisages a bicycle transport solution along Dzelzavas Street for the connection between Dzelzavas Street and Braslas Street, as well as bicycle transport will be able to cross the construction area.





FUTURE

TĒRBATAS STREET PROJECT

IN THE SUMMER OF 2020, RIGA MUNICIPALITY TRIED OUT THE IDEA OF A CITY SUMMER STREET FOR THE FIRST TIME,

closing the traffic on Terbatas Street in the section from Elizabetes Street to the entrance to the Vidzeme market for one month and allocating it to pedestrians and cyclists, street trade and various events.

- During this time, green recreation areas were created on Terbatas Street, and cafe terraces were expanded.
- The creation of a pedestrian street is a step towards ensuring a greener environment as well as the opportunity to organise more cultural events in the city centre.
- Active research is currently underway to decide on introducing the 'summer street' as an annual project.








PRESS HOUSE QUARTER

IT IS CURRENTLY HOUSED IN A PRINTING AND OFFICE BUILDING DESIGNED IN 1978 AND BUILT SPECIFICALLY FOR THE PRODUCTION OF PRESS.

- As part of the 1st phase of the project, a Class A office building, a multifunctional centre and a 4-star hotel will be developed.
- The 26,500 m² class A office centre is planned to meet the standards of BREEAM Excellent and nZEB or almost zero energy building.
- The multifunctional centre will combine retail, sports and medical services, a large dining area and 3 levels of surface parking.
- The roof of the multifunctional centre will be the first roof for a football pitch in the Baltics.
- The quarter will be surrounded and complemented by a modern public outdoor space, which will become a modern gathering place in Kīpsala.









KNOWLEDGE MILE – INNOVATION AND SCIENCE INFRASTRUCTURE IN PĀRDAUGAVA.

In Riga, the so-called campuses or student areas are concentrated practically next to the city centre. This creates an area where science, studies, business and the real estate market will develop.

The area around Skanste has a well-developed network of streets, which provides easy access to this area from other areas.





VEF SURROUNDINGS

Initiatives of VEFRESH-technology companies, real estate developers and Riga Municipality to develop the historic VEF district of the plant into a technology, culture and innovation centre. VEFRESH has the largest concentration of ICT professionals in the country. About 43% of all ICT exports are generated directly by VEFRESH. The initiative focuses on developing the VEF and Teika district as a modern local centre of business, housing and culture. The members of the movement include international companies such as Accenture, the largest mobile operator in Latvia LMT, as well as the City of Riga.

VEF guarter - a place to work, live, relax and create for people fascinated by the opportunities of technology and innovation. In the city development plan, Teika is planned to be preserved mainly as a compact residential and multi-storey residential area with construction of limited height, up to 5 floors, along Brīvības gatve.

According to the structure of buildings, the Teika neighbourhood is very multi-layered, so the transport network is currently evaluated as intricately structured, though links to other neighbourhoods and the city centre are efficient enough.

GRANĪTA STREET/ ŠĶIROTAVA

THE RIGA SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT STRATEGY UNTIL 2030 IDENTIFIES IT AS A PRIORITY DEVELOPMENT AREA.

The largest power capacities are available in the area. Large companies are located there – Grindeks, Forevers, Kalceks, Schneider Electric, DB Schenker, Groglass, etc. Extensive development is planned for all companies. For example, Grindeks plans to build and use an area of 3 ha – the former Šķirotava prison.

CITY CENTRE SURROUNDINGS

IT IS PLANNED TO BUILD MODERN OFFICE SPACE, WHICH WILL HELP ATTRACT FOREIGN INVESTORS.












