



According to data on population, Riga is the largest city in the Baltic States and the third largest (behind Saint Petersburg and Stockholm) in the region of the Baltic Sea.


The share of different nationalities in Riga²



FREEPORT OF RIGA

Key facts and numbers about the Freeport of Riga:

- 15 km along both banks of the river Daugava;
- Total area: 6 348 ha;
- Open for sailing throughout the whole year;
- Status of free economic zone;
- Total length of piers – 18.2 km;
- Maximum depth at piers – 14.5 m;
- Warehouse area – 370 979 m²;
- Cargo storage area capacity – 1 926 362 m²;
- Cargo handling capacity – 58.2 million tons/year;
- Freezer facility capacity – 25 500 t;
- Reservoir capacity – 665 063 m³;
- The largest port in the Baltic States in 2014 by cargo turnover – 41.1 million tons;
- Ship visits in 2014 – 3 797;
- Up to 80 % of cargo turnover – transit cargos sent to or received from the Commonwealth of Independent States (CIS);

- Operating 35 stevedoring companies and 28 shipping agents;
- The main cargos – containers, different metals, wood, carbon, fertilizers, chemical cargos and petroleum products.⁸

The structure of transhipped cargo in January – July 2015



Number of entering cruise ships and passengers in the Freeport of Riga




The number of ferry passengers in the Freeport of Riga



RIGA INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

Comparing financial data of 200 airports, in 2014 the Air Transport Research Society (ATRS) recognised Riga International Airport as the most competitive airport in Europe, calculating expenditures and tariff structure per passenger.⁹

Amount of cargo (t), passengers and flights in the Riga International Airport




In 2014 the average share of transit passengers – 9 %, the amount of transit/ transfer passengers – 29 %.



In 2014 the number of passengers in railway transportation reached 649 million passengers/km, and it is expected that railway transportation will be used more often.¹²

Land cargo transport

Land cargo transport makes approximately 29 % of the total cargo transport amount in the country and in 2014 more than 80 % of land cargo transport was particularly domestic road transportations.

Tourism


- Number of accommodation places: 119;

The main tourism promoter, as well as developer of the sector is the Riga Tourism Development Agency, more widely known by its tourism brand name *Live Riga*. The Agency is dealing with tourism promotion and popularisation of tourism opportunities abroad by bringing together almost 200 different companies and creating image of Riga as recognisable tourism destination. During the last year the number of served tourists in Riga has increased by 15%, including foreign guests – about 16%. In 2014 the number of sleeping nights in tourists' accommodation places in the city increased by 8%.


